The Victim was working as an Uber Eats driver and was delivering a food order to W1, a doctor at Loretto Hospital. He was driving a light blue Dodge Caravan. When he got to the hospital, he parked the van and left it running on the street right in front of the hospital entrance and went inside to deliver the food. As he did so, three individuals, including the D, are observed on surveillance video walking down Flournoy. The D is observed wearing a brown coat and pink sweatpants. As the V entered the hospital, the D then walked to the V's van, opened the driver's door and got in, sitting in the driver's seat. The other 2 individuals who were with her then entered into the van from the passenger side. While they were inside the V's van, the V exited the hospital and, observing people inside his vehicle, began to run towards it.

As he approached the passenger side, the D sped off, with the Victim still right next to the door and grabbing the handle. The D did not stop but rather, continued to accelerate, with the V continuing to hold the handle of the front passenger door. As the D continued to speed off, the V, who was still holding on to the handle attempting to stop the D, fell to the ground, at which point the D ran him over with the rear passenger tire.

This entire incident was captured on multiple surveillance videos.

W1, the doctor who had placed the food order, had sent a text to the V to come through the main entrance and leave the food with security. As the minutes passed, W1 noticed that he had not been notified that the food was delivered yet observed that the Victim's location was still near the main entrance of the hospital. He then went down to the lobby but didn't see the V. W1 then went

outside and found him lying in a pool of blood on Flournoy. He noticed that the picture of the V on the Uber Eats app matched the man lying in the street. He then called the number listed in the app and noticed that the phone on the ground next to the V began to ring. 911 was called and police and paramedics responded. The V was pronounced deceased a short time later.

Police were able to recover the video and observe the entire incident. They then tracked the V's van using license plate readers, in various areas of Chicago and the suburbs near the hospital, ultimately locating it parked in Maywood at about 11:30 a.m. the same morning as the homicide. They set up surveillance on the van and approximately a half hour later, observed the D arrive in a separate vehicle, pull behind the V's van, and then observed her enter the driver's seat of it. She was with her sister at this time. Officers observed her to be wearing the brown jacket and pink pants that she was observed wearing when she committed the homicide hours earlier. As they approached her, the D exited the driver's seat of the V's van and began to flee. As officers chased her, they observed her removing the brown jacket and discarding keys. She was quickly apprehended and the jacket and keys were recovered. The keys she was observed tossing as she fled were found to belong to the V's van. D's sister informed police that she was out with the D the night before but separated prior to the homicide. She confirmed that the D was wearing the brown jacket and pink sweatpants the night of the homicide and circled the D in a still shot from the surveillance video from the hospital.

Post Miranda, the Defendant admitted to taking the Victim's van at the hospital and admitted to seeing the Victim running towards the vehicle and taking off. She also identified herself in a still photo from the surveillance video outside the hospital from the moment before she entered the van and admitted that the clothes she had on when arrested were the same clothes she had on when the homicide happened.

BACKGROUND

Pending: Arrested 2/11/26 by Melrose Park – Pcan/ Resisting PO/ Obstructing PO/ 6-303/ Traffic Offenses- Defendant was driver of a car pulled over for traffic violations. D provided her sister's name to PO's. Once outside of car, the D attempted to flee from the police but was caught and placed into custody.

Cited and Release – First court date 3/19. State is filing a revocation.

The D then pushed her to the ground and said, “if you don’t give me your backpack I’m going to take your life.” She then took the backpack from her and stated, “if your wallet is not in the bag I’m going to kill you.” The D and another individual then beat her.

13CR1186802 – PSMV – 7 years IDOC concurrent to 13CR0700002 + 13CR0701702

PSMV conviction stems from the robbery investigation, which revealed the car the D and her co-offenders used during the robbery was stolen.

11C44067501 – Escape – 3 years IDOC- D was arrested for fleeing and eluding at speeds of 90 mph. Once arrested, and being transported to the hospital, she fled on foot from the officers before being arrested again.
